

Class Availability and Schedules

During your visit to Burton 4-H Center, you will have the opportunity to participate in 5 day classes and 2 evening classes lead by Burton instructors. Day classes are typically 2 hours in length and night classes are 1 hour in length.

Schools are divided into teaching groups comprised of a maximum of 15 children and a minimum of 1 chaperone. Groups should be divided into mixed gender groups prior to arrival. Please divide chaperones equally among the teaching groups.

Night classes will be led by Burton instructors on one evening of your visit. Schools are responsible for planning and facilitating activities for the other evening. Review the following pages for suggestions on school led activities and Burton led classes.
